2. Classification and Name.



3. Name Source. NORMANDY (CG 60) commemorates the massive Allied landings in France in June 1944, which projected American power ashore in Western Europe and led to the eventual defeat of Nazi Germany. The U. S. Navy had direct responsibility for two of the five landing beaches at Normandy. Gunfire support and the buildup of men and supplies, which allowed the Allied breakout from the Normandy area late in July 1944, were two of the many naval contributions to this campaign. No previous U. S. Navy ship has borne this name.
